Palm Sunday



Today we proceed into the church accompanied by shouts of "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" only to hear in the second Gospel of the day "Crucify Him! Crucify Him." What do we do with this? How can we go forward and not be manipulated by the crowd that shouts "Hosanna" one moment, and a week later calls for Jesus' death? Perhaps the best way to travel this last week - the only week in the Church's year that we call Holy - is to do so in the company of the poor and the broken, the marginalised, the innocent, the abused. If we are to stand at the foot of the cross with Mary and John and hear Jesus make us all His brothers and sisters and hear Him say "Behold this is your mother, this your son" then let us like Jesus, empty ourselves and let us follow Him.

Lent Reflection - Weekend of 9 & 10 April

Today we read the passion narrative from the Gospel of St Luke. It is not by any means for the faint hearted. Even if it is familiar to us, we should try to remember how extraordinary it is. After so many centuries of cruelty, crucifixion still ranks as one of the most appalling things people have ever thought to do to their fellow humans. Yet this was how God chose to show the depth of His love. God was prepared to go to any lengths for us. The letter to the Philippians says that Jesus did not cling to His equality with God but emptied Himself to assume the condition of a slave. Why? The only possible explanation is love. Anyone who has loved another knows that it will inevitably bring a share of suffering. Jesus walks alongside all who suffer. He shares their cross as they share His. The fact that crucifixion was so common in the Roman world should also make us pause for a moment. Jesus lived and died in a world in which people were routinely degraded. He met plenty of them in His travels, people cast by the wayside, and helped many. For those without power, life was fragile, even cheap. Has much changed? Throughout Lent, Caritas Australia has invited us to share the work of Project Compassion. The stories we have encountered remind us that the world is still an uneven field. Project Compassion invites us to respond in love to free people in captivity to very challenging circumstances. It invites us in a small way to carry the cross, to live in hope of the Resurrection. Perhaps this week, as well as joining in the services of Holy Week, we can take some time to sit quietly with the passion narrative from Luke's Gospel on our own. Think about all the characters we meet: Peter, Judas, Pilate, Herod, the women of Jerusalem, the soldiers, the two criminals, the women from Galilee, the centurion, Joseph of Arimathea. Try to see the events from each of their perspectives. The quietly see them from your own perspective, from your world in 2022. Pray in humble gratitude.

Prayer of Intercession

We pray for a renewal of our faith in Holy Week. Through works such as Project Compassion, may we walk alongside our brothers and sisters towards the new life of Easter.

Prayer For Ukraine
 We turn to you, Lord Jesus Christ, Word of God made flesh for us, and we entrust the people of Ukraine to you who once said to your disciples, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you" (Jn 14:27). Hear the cry of your people; change the hearts of those who have unleashed such suffering on the innocent; strengthen the resolve of those who are working to bring the conflict to an end; be close to those who have been driven from their homes and from their homeland; heal the wounds of mind and heart inflicted on the children; comfort the frightened and the lost; strengthen the faith of those who are bereaved; give eternal rest and joy to those who have died. In your agony on the cross you entrusted your mother to the beloved disciple, entrusted him and all disciples to your mother's care (Jn 19:26). It was through Mary's faith that you, the Word made flesh, came to dwell among us. That same faith strengthened Mary as she stood at the foot of the cross. We pray that your suffering people in Ukraine may know and experience that Mary stands with them, too, in this time of their great distress. You have given Mary to us as the Mother of the Church and the Help of Christians.
